The group have also spent £2000 to improve the facilities available to the children that use our P4-P7 playground. #### School Attendance

School attendance is very important at all stages of the school year, but during the month of May it is vital that your child be at school each day and before the 9am bell. May is traditionally the month where teachers administer a number of examinations designed to show the progress your child has made throughout the course of the academic year. If your child is absent from school and misses one or more of these important assessments, then it is particularly difficult to gauge where your child is at in terms of their learning and this can impact their next year at school. We would ask that all parents ensure that their child/children do not miss out on these important assessments.

#### School Routines For Promoting Independence

We recently informed all parents that we were working hard to promote the independence of our pupils from P1-P7. We asked that children from P1-P3 be escorted to the classroom door and left their by their parent/guardian. We also asked that the children from P4-P7 be left at external doors and be allowed to make their own way to their classroom from there. We are happy to report that we have seen some good progress in terms of the children's independence skills. It has been great to see parents allowing children to carry their own school bags, hang up their own coat and make their way to their own desk without the help of an adult. We would like to say a huge thank you to all of our parents who have supported us in our efforts and we hope that this simple early morning routine will continue to help develop our children's independence skills.

### Sponsored Silence

On Tuesday, our children took part in a sponsored silence to raise money for school funds. If you have been watching the news recently, you will not have failed to notice the country wide concern in regards to the state of educational services in this country. As a result of there being no government at Stormont, budgets have been severely affected, meaning that more cuts are having to be made. The cuts to education are in the region of £50 million across the north. As you can appreciate, this will have a huge impact on the amount of money that St. Patrick's will have to spend on your child/children. We would ask that you all support our Sponsored Silence, by ensuring that your family makes a contribution by sending in 1 sponsor card and the money by this Friday. All of the money raised will be spent directly on the children, with the Student Council having the final say on what it is spent on. In these financially testing times ahead, the support of our parent body and community are very much needed and appreciated.

#### Save Daisy Hill Campaign

As well as cuts to education, it has become clear over the recent weeks that there is a strong possibility that Daisy Hill Hospital may lose its accident and emergency department. As a school family we should be united in our opposition to all cuts of vital services in our community. We would ask that our parents therefore, support the campaign to save the A&E department at Daisy Hill Hospital. The dangers associated with losing such an excellent service are too great for us all to ignore. As a school, we cannot imagine that in the event of an emergency, we would have to wait to transfer a pupil or colleague to Craigavon Area Hospital instead of Daisy Hill. Please get out there and show your opposition to the possible closure of our local A&E at our local hospital.
